



## Increasing National Board Certified Teachers in Maryland's Schools

Recognizing that quality educators are key to student success, the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) is implementing a *Blueprint for Maryland's Future* program to attract and retain National Board Certified Teachers (NBCT) in the State's schools. This program increases the salary by **\$10,000 dollars for Nationally Board Certified Teachers who** are teachers actively teaching in Maryland public schools. Teachers staying or moving to a low performing school will receive an additional \$7,000 added to their salary.

The National Board Certification State and Local Incentive Program provides partial fee support to initial and renewal candidates for National Board Certification who qualify (COMAR 13A.07.08). This program is for teachers working in Maryland school districts and is dependent on appropriations by the Maryland General Assembly. Candidates who would like to participate in the Incentive Program should contact their local school system to discuss the selection procedures and eligibility requirements.
